Baroness Pauline Perry

Baroness Perry is an educationalist, a Conservative politician, and a member of the British House of Lords. She served as one of Her Majesty's Inspectors of Schools in England for 17 years, in 1981 attaining the rank of Chief Inspector. In 1986 she became <u>Vice-Chancellor</u> of <u>South Bank Polytechnic</u>, and serving during its transition to a university became the first woman in history to run a British university.

In 1994 Baroness Perry was elected Head of Lucy Cavendish College in Cambridge University where she served until 2001. After leaving Cambridge she took on various roles, including Pro Chancellor of Surrey University, Chair of Council at Roehampton University and was made an Honorary Fellow of Girton and Lucy Cavendish Colleges in Cambridge University.

For more than 40 years, Baroness Perry has made a major contribution to Higher Education in many roles, including: President of the Foundation for Higher Education, Chair of the All-Party Parliamentary Group on Universities for 13 years and chair, trustee, and president of many higher education establishments. She has been awarded eight Honorary Doctorates and 7 Honorary Fellowships.

Baroness Perry has hosted the NCUP luncheon at the House of Lords, yearly, since April 2016.

In October 2016, Baroness Perry became the Patron for the National Conference of University

Professor Dame Madeleine Atkins, DBE

Professor Dame Madeleine Atkins, DBE, DL, FAcSS, became the ninth president of Lucy Cavendish College, University of Cambridge, on October 1st, 2018.

Her background includes reading Law and History as an undergraduate at Cambridge University, teaching in a large comprehensive school in Huntingdon, and completing a Ph.D. and post-doctoral research contracts at the University of Nottingham.

Following various senior positions at Newcastle University, including Pro-Vice-Chancellor, she was Vice-Chancellor of Coventry University from 2004 to 2013.

President Atkins then joined the Higher Education Funding Council for England (HEFCE) as its Chief Executive in January 2014, retaining that post until March 2018.
